B: Stakeholder feedback

- a) The Student Perception of Teaching survey provided excellent anonymous feedback to the Senior Leaders on any issues relating to teachers promoting a welcoming, caring, respectful and safe environment in each class.
- b) Parents, students and staff gave input to setting the strategic goals for the school. These included aspects of student well-being and student safety.

C: Strategies to attain this Outcome

- 1. Use the Creating Welcoming, Caring, Respectful and Safe Learning Environments guide called "The Walk Around: A School Leader's Observation Guide" to identify current practices. Redo 'The Walk Around' at the end of the year to identify progress and improvements.
- 2. Use Student Perception of Teacher Survey mid-year to provide the team leader and staff member an opportunity to review student perceptions, especially in areas of safety, caring and respect in the classroom. Where necessary, this may form part of the teacher's TPGP.
- 3. Grade 6 to 7 transition: Strategies to help students feel safe travelling to/from school on their own for the first time (only 83% last year).
- 4. Provide service activities for students to be involved in.
- 5. Grades 7-9 Servant Leadership Courses.
- 6. House Events
- 7. Kindness Week, Anti-bullying Programs.
- 8. School Theme in 2021/22 is "Called by Love, Called to Love".
- 9. Appointment of a female Guidance Counsellor.
- 10. High School Pastoral Advisory and Care Teams will meet daily to build community and support in small groups.
